<b>Aussie Boomer</b>	Syzygium "Aussie Boomer" - PBR	as marked	A fast growing dwarf lilly-pilly. Excellent for hedges and topiary. Grows to about 2m high. Hardy and reliable. (Myrtaceae)
<b>Blush Silky Oak</b>	Opisthiolepis heterophylla	200mm \$25	Beautiful rainforest tree with leathery leaves (pinnate on young plants) with a silver to bronze felt on the undersides. Fairly fast growing. Best in a protected spot, not suitable for hot dry areas. (Proteaceae)
<b>Common Ginger</b>	Alpinia caerulea "Red"	200mm \$25	Clumping foliage plant with stalks to 2m high. Leaves undersides a striking deep maroon colour. Small white flowers. Attractive fruit. Full sun or part shade. Not suitable for dry inland areas. (Zingiberaceae)
<b>Fishtail Oak</b>	Neorites kevediana	200mm \$25	Beautiful small tree with extremely attractive, long pinnate leaves and deep maroon new growth. Cream flowers in terminal spikes. Not suitable for dry inland areas. Makes a great tub plant. (Proteaceae)
<b>Grey Rhodomyrtus</b>	Rhodomyrtus effusa	200mm \$25	Medium to large shrub with long weeping branches. Attractive rusty hairs on leaves. White flowers. Plant in full sun or semi-shade. (Myrtaceae)
<b>Hard Alder</b>	Pullea stutzeri	200mm \$25	Bushy tree with beautiful foliage and bright red new growth. Best in protected, well watered position. Masses of small white fluffy flowers. (Cunoniaceae)
<b>Hot Flush</b>	Syzygium "Hot Flush" PBR	as marked	A beautiful selection of Acmena (Syzygium) smithii, with bright red flushes of new growth. Can be pruned to shape. An excellent hedge or topiary plant. (Myrtaceae)
<b>Ivory Curl Tree</b>	Buckinghamia celsissima	200mm \$25	Small tree with spectacular display of cream flowers. Very hardy. (Proteaceae)
<b>Lady Apple</b>	Syzygium suborbiculare	200mm \$25	Very hardy tree with large, thick, glossy leaves. Large white flowers and red edible fruit. (Myrtaceae)
<b>Little Evodia</b>	Evodiella muelleri	200mm \$25	Small tree with grey bark to about 6 metres with glossy green, trifoliate leaves up to 7.5 cm long. Clusters of bright pink flowers occur along the branches during summer followed by green fruits. Ulysses butterfly host plant.
<b>Native Sundew</b>	Drosera binata	\$15	Carnivorous habit, fast growing plant, leaves covered with sticky droplets. Requires bright sunlight, stand in water in summer, moist only in winter. Semi dormant to dormant in winter. Feed lightly during growing months if indoors.

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<b>Pink Satinash</b>	<i>Syzygium sayeri</i>	200mm \$25	Very fast growing, hardy, small tree with white flowers. Ideal screen plant. Plant in full sun for best results. (Myrtaceae)
<b>Plum Satinash</b>	<i>Syzygium cryptophlebium</i>	200mm \$25	Shrub with bright pink pendulous new growth. Protect from dry wind, keep moist. White flowers and bright purple fruit. (Myrtaceae)
<b>Red Eungella Satinash</b>	<i>Syzygium (Acmena) resa</i>	200mm \$25	Small to medium tree with red new growth and white flowers. Small red fruit. (Myrtaceae)
<b>Rock Umbrella Tree</b>	<i>Schefflera versteegii</i>	200mm \$25	Rare umbrella tree from the Cape York Peninsula. Thick bright green leaflets held in a circle round the leaf-stalk. Light brown scales on the leaf stalks and shoot tip. Massive panicles of pinkish flowers. (Araliaceae)
<b>Small Leaf Lilly-Pilly</b>	<i>Syzygium luehmannii</i>	200mm \$25	Highly ornamental small tree with brilliant pink/red weeping foliage, white flowers and edible red fruit. (Myrtaceae)
<b>Vic Stockwell's Puzzle</b>	<i>Stockwellia quadrifida</i>	200mm \$25	Very rare tree with spectacular bright red to pink new growth. Fairly hardy. (Myrtaceae)
<b>Wollemi Pine</b>	<i>Wollemia nobilis</i>	150mm \$49	Rare and ancient Australian native conifer with unusual fern-like foliage, multi stemming habit and bubbling bark when mature. (Araucariaceae)
<b>Yellow Satinash</b>	<i>Syzygium canicortex</i>	200mm \$25	Beautiful tree with brilliant red new growth. Small, bright red fruit and white flowers. (Myrtaceae)
