Acacia macradenia	Zig-Zag Wattle	Very large, fast growing, spreading shrub with zig-zag branchlets. Masses of very bright, dark yellow flowers in profusion in spring. (Fabaceae)
Acacia podalyriifolia	Mt Morgan Wattle	Fast growing large shrub with silvery phyllodes and yellow flowers. Also known as Queensland Silver Wattle. (Fabaceae)
Acalypha lyonsii	Native Acalypha	Small, attractive, very hardy shrub with tiny, serrated leaves. Prune to thicken up for the first year. Ideal fill in plant. (Euphorbiaceae)
Aceratium doggrelii	Buff Carabeen	Beautiful densely conical tree with upward pointing branches, small leaves. (Elaeocarpaceae)
Acronychia acidula	Lemon Aspen	Small tree with large glossy leaves and large white flowers. Fruit suitable for jam making. (Rutaceae)
Acronychia crassipetala	Hairy Aspen	Very hardy shrub or small tree. Creamy coloured flowers attract many small butterflies, yellow fruit is eaten by pigeons. Best in moist or very wet conditions. (Rutaceae)
Acronychia laevis	Scrub Aspen	Large shrub with dense bushy habit, deep green glossy foliage, and attractive purple fruit. Drought hardy. (Rutaceae)
Acronychia peninsularis	Peninsula Aspen	Shrub with paired trifoliolate leaves, small white flowers and white berries, from Cape York Peninsula. (Rutaceae)
Agapetes meiniana	Misty Bells	Vine that produces beautiful bright pink tubular flowers. Plant in protected spot with lots of moisture. Makes good tub plant or hanging basket. (Ericaceae)
Agathis robusta	Queensland Kauri	A giant, slow growing, tropical conifer from Queensland's coastal ranges with broad, thick-textured, dark green leaves. An ancient Gondwanan relic with iconic status in Queensland. (Araucariaceae)
Aglaiia sapindina	Boodyarra	Small tree with compound leaves and yellow flowers followed by masses of orange fruit. Attractive to birds. (Meliaceae)
Albizia procera	Forest Siris	Medium tree with open spreading habit. Attractive blue-green leaves and small cream flowers. Hardy. (Fabaceae)
Alectryon connatus	Alectryon	Hardy large shrub or small tree from coastal or dry rainforest. Orange fruit with showy, bright red aril surrounding the seeds eaten by lots of birds including the Purple Crowned Pigeon. (Sapindaceae)
Alloxylon flammeum	Tree Waratah	Medium tree with glossy leaves and spectacular bright red flowers. Protect from wind and provide adequate moisture. Floral emblem of the former Eacham Shire. (Proteaceae)
Alocasia brisbanensis	Cunjevoi	Lily-like plant with large, soft leaves. Does best in semi-shade with plenty of moisture. (Araceae)
Araucaria bidwillii	Bunya Pine	One of Australia's tallest and most distinctive conifers, with its domed crown of numerous radiating branches. It has been growing in Australia since the Jurassic - the Age of Dinosaurs. (Araucariaceae)
Archidendron lucyi	Scarlet Bean	Small tree with large leaves and open habit. Beautiful fluffy white perfumed flowers borne on the branches. Extremely decorative orange seed pods. (Fabaceae)

Argophyllum sp. Cape York	Cape York Argophyllum	Rare plant. Attractive foliage with sheen to upper-side of leaf and silver underside. Semi-shade with lots of water. (Argophyllaceae)
Argophyllum sp. The Boulders		A rare shrub with very attractive glossy leaves that have a silver sheen on the underside. Requires regular watering. Does best in semi-shade. (Argophyllaceae)
Argyrodendron polyandrum	Black Tulip Oak	Tree with large glossy leaves, bronze on the underside. Quite hardy. (Malvaceae)
Argyrodendron sp. Big Tableland	Big Tableland Tulip Oak	Attractive small tree with stiff whorled leaves and rusty brown new growth. (Malvaceae)
Argyrodendron trifoliolatum	Brown Crowsfoot Elm	Small to medium tree with bronze sheen under leaves. Cream flowers. (Malvaceae)
Asplenium sp. N.T.	Native Fern	Beautiful fern with long dainty weeping fronds. A rare plant from NT. Looks spectacular in a hanging basket. (Aspleniaceae)
Asteromyrtus brassii	Cape York Tea Tree	Large shrub or small tree with unusual spherical, deep red flowers along the branches. Hardy. Flowers all year. (Myrtaceae)
Austromyrtus dulcis	Midyim	Small shrub with small pink flowers and edible fruit. Very hardy. Plant in full sun or semi-shade. (Myrtaceae)
Austromyrtus dulcis x tenuifolia	Hybrid midyim	Small bushy slender-leafed shrub with masses of small pale pink flowers followed by edible fruit. (Myrtaceae)
Backhousia citriodora	Lemon Myrtle	Large shrub or small bushy tree with masses of fluffy cream flowers. Crushed leaves have a fantastic lemon scent. Quite hardy. (Myrtaceae)
Backhousia enata	Tully River Myrtle	Large shrub with attractive weeping habit. Small glossy leaves. Does well in the shade. Small white flowers. (Myrtaceae)
Backhousia myrtifolia	Grey Myrtle	Large dense shrub or small tree with masses of white fluffy flowers. Very hardy. (Myrtaceae)
Baeckea "Feather Tips"	Feather Tips	Small shrub. Dainty form with weeping, feathery branches. May be pruned heavily into a dense bush if required. (Myrtaceae)

Baeckea virgata "Miniature"	Dwarf Baeckea	Ideal for rockeries, this dwarf form of Baeckea spreads to form a small, mounded shrub. Masses of white flowers. Prune lightly after flowering to keep compact. (Myrtaceae)
Banksia dentata	Cape York Banksia	Large shrub to small tree. Large serrated leaves and yellow banksia flowers. (Proteaceae)
Banksia plagiocarpa	Blue Banksia or Hinchinbrook Banksia	Large shrub or small tree with stiff leaves and unusual large bluish coloured brushes. Best in high rainfall areas. In drier areas, requires a humid protected position. Not frost tolerant. (Proteaceae)
Banksia robur	Swamp Banksia	Medium shrub with large stiff serrated leaves and green, changing to cream, flowers. Will tolerate damp situations. (Proteaceae)
Banksia spinulosa	Hairpin Banksia	Small shrub. Dense habit with spectacular large gold Banksia flowers. Best in full sun. Suitable for most areas. (Proteaceae)
Barringtonia calyptata	Mango Pine	Very handsome tree with large leaves and huge racemes of fluffy white flowers that attract birds. (Lecythidaceae)
Beilschmiedia bancroftii	Yellow Walnut	Tree with large green/orange/brown fruit which has a spicy nutmeg/cinnamon smell when cut. (Lauraceae)
Bombax ceiba	Kapok Tree	Sparsely branched deciduous tree with brilliant scarlet flowers in late winter and seed capsules that release kapok. (Malvaceae)
Boronia keysii	Boronia	An evergreen shrub with pink star shaped flowers appearing in early spring. Prefers light, well drained soil in a protected shaded position. Is drought resistant but frost tender. (Rutaceae)
Brachychiton acerifolius	Flame Tree	Produces masses of brilliant red flowers. Deciduous when flowering. Hardy and fast growing. Food plant of Common Aeroplane and Penciled Blue Butterflies. (Authorised Propagators Qld.No. APQF198/000050) (Malvaceae)
Brachychiton australis	Broad-leaved Bottle Tree	Attractive tree with smooth green trunk. White flowers. Very hardy. (Authorised Propagators Qld.No. APQF198/000050) (Malvaceae)
Brachychiton garrawayae	Garraway's brachychiton	Large shrub or small tree with attractive pink flowers. Unusual plant from Cape York Peninsula. (Authorised Propagators Qld.No. APQF198/000050) (Malvaceae)
Brachychiton vitifolius	Vine-leaf Kurrajong	Brachychiton vitifolius. An unusual brachychiton from Cape York Peninsula. This is only a very small plant, but it has large lobed leaves and lovely bright pink flowers. The foliage and most parts of the plant are soft and furry. (Authorised Propagators Qld.No. APQF198/000050) (Sterculiaceae)
Breynia cernua	Common Breynia	Small shrub with attractive foliage with mass of bright red berries. Very hardy, plant in full sun or semi-shade. (Phyllanthaceae)
Breynia sp. Iron Range	Red Coffee-Bush	Shrub with red new growth and masses of small red berries. Food plant of Common Grass Yellow Butterfly. (Phyllanthaceae)
Buchanania arborescens	Satinwood	Bushy tree with large leaves like those of a mango. Small black fruit are very good to eat. Hardy. (Anacardiaceae)

Callistemon "Dawson River"	Dawson River	Tall weeping shrub with red flowers. Attractive to birds. Very hardy. Will tolerate both wet and dry conditions. Can be pruned to act as a screening plant. (Myrtaceae)

Cardwellia sublimis	Northern Silky Oak	Handsome tree with large glossy compound leaves and very spectacular creamy white flowers followed by huge woody seed pods. Needs a moist protected position. Unsuitable for dry areas. (Proteaceae)
Carmona retusa	Carmona	Small shrub with dark green, stiff foliage and small white flowers on arching twigs. Very hardy. Full sun or part shade. (Boraginaceae)
Carnarvonia montana	Red Silky Oak	Beautiful large shrub or small tree with unusual compound leaves. Fantastic foliage with very showy rusty brown new growth. Ideal tub plant. (Proteaceae)
Casearia dallachii	Silver Birch	Shrub bearing showy orange fruit with seeds enclosed in red aril. (Flacourtiaceae)
Cassia magnifolia	Large Flowered Cassia	Striking rambling shrub with very large, glossy leaves and spectacular yellow flowers. Likes open sunny position/arid areas. (Fabaceae)
Cassia sp. Paluma Range	Golden Shower	Small tree with glossy dark green foliage, spectacular racemes of bright yellow flowers, and beautiful brown papery bark. A beautiful native cassia. Very hardy. (Fabaceae)
Cassia tomentella	Little Cigar Cassia	Spectacular large shrub to small tree with large racemes of showy yellow flowers. Very hardy. (Fabaceae)
Castanospermum australe	Black Bean	Medium spreading tree renowned for its lovely timber. Masses of yellow flowers along the branches. Large decorative woody seed pods. Often slow growing for first few years. Benefits from protection when young. (Fabaceae)
Cerbera floribunda	Cassowary Plum	A medium tree. The fragrant flowers are white or cream. The blue fruits are avidly eaten by cassowaries. Needs protection from hot sun when young. (Apocynaceae)
Citrus australasica	Finger Lime	Small, dense, bushy shrub with sausage-like lime-flavoured fruit. Very hardy, but slow growing. Suitable for making drinks. Not suitable for dry inland areas. (Rutaceae)
Citrus garrawayae	Mt White Lime	Finger lime from Cape York. Good bush tucker. Small, dense, bushy shrub with sausage-like lime-flavoured fruit suitable for making drinks. (Rutaceae)
Citrus inodora	Russell River Lime	Shrubby tree with glossy leaves and spines on twigs. Edible oblong lime fruit up to 6.5 cm long and 3 cm diameter. Lowland rainforest plant, must be in shade with plenty of moisture. (Rutaceae)
Cleistanthus apodus	Weeping Cleistanthus	Medium weeping shrub with beautiful pink new growth. Hardy. A great screen. (Euphorbiaceae)
Cleistanthus hylandii	Bernie's Cleistanthus	Hardy large shrub to small tree with extremely beautiful bright red to purple new growth. From Cape York Peninsula. A great screen. (Euphorbiaceae)

Cordia dichotoma	Glue Berry	Very hardy tree with attractive weeping branches and masses of pink fruit which attract birds. Food plant of Common Aeroplane Butterfly. (Boraginaceae)
Cordyline manners-suttoniae	Palm Lily	Palm-like plant. Large bright green strap-like leaves. Large bunches of bright red, very showy berries. Best in semi-shade. (Asparagaceae)
Cordyline murchisoniae	Palm-Lilly	Small, slender-stemmed rainforest palm-lily. Panicles of small mauve flowers. Good foliage tub plant. Best in shade or semi-shade. (Asparagaceae)
Corynocarpus cribbianus	Cribbwood	Tree with large stiff glossy leaves. Showy large deep red fruit eaten by cassowaries. (Corynocarpaceae)
Costus potierae	Native Crepe Ginger	Rhizomatous plant. Leaves held in a spiral round the stems. Flowers white with yellow markings, in heads on the stem tips. Needs shade, ample moisture and well manured soil. (Zingiberaceae)
Cryptocarya hypospodia	Northern Laurel	Tree with large leaves. Food plant of Blue Triangle Butterfly. Fruit attracts birds. (Lauraceae)
Cryptocarya laevigata	Glossy Laurel	Bushy shrub/small tree with shiny green foliage, pale green new growth and bright red fruit. Food plant of the Blue Triangle Butterfly. Excellent for understorey or shade. (Lauraceae)
