Latin name	Common name	Description
<b>Acacia aulacocarpa</b>	Hickory Wattle	Fast growing and very hardy tree with masses of yellow flowers. Rounded dense crown. Timber tree. (Fabaceae)
<b>Acacia auriculiformis</b>	Ear-Pod Wattle	Tree with yellow flowers. Very hardy and fast growing. Dark green shiny leaves. Dense crown. (Fabaceae)
<b>Acacia crassicarpa</b>	Northern Wattle	Small tree with large leaves and yellow flowers. Very fast growing and hardy. (Fabaceae)
<b>Acacia fimbriata</b>	Brisbane Wattle	Fast growing large shrub to small tree with beautiful weeping foliage and dainty yellow fluffy flowers. Best in cooler climates. (Fabaceae)
<b>Acacia flavescens</b>	Northern Wattle	Tall shrub or small tree with large leaves. Attractive red/purple new growth. Masses of fluffy white flowers. Hardy & fast growing. (Fabaceae)
<b>Acacia fleckeri</b>	Wenlock Wattle	Small tree with yellow flowers in May and June. Hardy and fast growing. (Fabaceae)
<b>Acacia holosericea</b>	Silver-Leaved Wattle	Large shrub with beautiful silvery leaves and bright yellow flowers. Very hardy and fast growing. Full sun. (Fabaceae)
<b>Acacia leptocarpa</b>	Northern Golden Wattle	Small tree with dark green foliage and spikes of bright orange flowers. Very hardy. Plant in full sun. (Fabaceae)
<b>Acacia macradenia</b>	Zig-Zag Wattle	Very large, fast growing, spreading shrub with zig-zag branchlets. Masses of very bright, dark yellow flowers in profusion in spring. (Fabaceae)
<b>Acacia mangium</b>	Brown Salwood	Extremely fast growing hardy tree with large green leaves and creamy flowers. Good timber. (Fabaceae)
<b>Acacia melanoxylon</b>	Black Wattle	Tree with creamy white flowers. Fast growing and suitable for frosty areas. Timber tree. (Fabaceae)
<b>Acacia shirleyi</b>	Lancewood	Small tree with yellow flowers and grey foliage. Extremely hardy. Suitable for the dry inland. (Fabaceae)
<b>Acacia simsii</b>	Sim's Wattle	Small to medium shrub with narrow lime-green leaves and very showy display of bright yellow flowers. Hardy. Full sun. (Fabaceae)
<b>Agathis robusta</b>	Queensland Kauri	A giant, slow growing, tropical conifer from Queensland's coastal ranges with broad, thick-textured, dark green leaves. An ancient Gondwanan relic with iconic status in Queensland. (Araucariaceae)
<b>Aglaia sapindina</b>	Boodyarra	Small tree with compound leaves and yellow flowers followed by masses of orange fruit. Attractive to birds. (Meliaceae)
<b>Asteromyrtus symphyocarpa</b>	Liniment Tree	Decorative large shrub or small tree with weeping habit and globular yellow-orange fluffy flowers. Tolerates a wide range of soils. Suitable for screening. (Myrtaceae)
<b>Callistemon pachyphyllus</b>	Wallum Bottlebrush	Hardy, slender shrub with large bottlebrush flowers in spring and autumn. Will tolerate damp soil situations. Benefits from regular pruning. (Myrtaceae)

Latin name	Common name	Description
<b>Callistemon polandii</b>	Red Bottlebrush	Compact well shaped medium shrub. Large red brushes with golden tipped stamens. (Myrtaceae)
<b>Callistemon recurvus</b>	Tinaroo Dazzler	Medium weeping shrub with small leaves and bright red flowers. Very hardy. (Myrtaceae)
<b>Callistemon salignus</b>	White Bottlebrush	White flowers. Makes a good screen. (Myrtaceae)
<b>Callistemon viminalis</b>	Weeping Bottlebrush	Medium to large shrub with red bottlebrush flowers. Weeping foliage. Fast growing and hardy. (Myrtaceae)
<b>Castanospermum australe</b>	Black Bean	Medium spreading tree renowned for its lovely timber. Masses of yellow flowers along the branches. Large decorative woody seed pods. Often slow growing for first few years. Benefits from protection when young. (Fabaceae)
<b>Corymbia citriodora</b>	Lemon Scented Gum	Tall, fast growing tree with beautiful smooth trunk and lemon scent to leaves. Hardy. Timber tree. (Myrtaceae)
<b>Corymbia leichhardtii</b>	Yellowjacket	Small to medium tree with attractive golden to orange/yellow bark. Terminal spikes of white flowers. Hardy. (Myrtaceae)
<b>Corymbia maculata</b>	Spotted Gum	Medium to tall tree. Smooth bark which shreds in small irregular flakes giving a spotted appearance. Timber tree. (Myrtaceae)
<b>Corymbia rhodops</b>	Red Throated Bloodwood	Small bloodwood with spectacular terminal clusters of cream flowers which have a deep red centre. (Myrtaceae)
<b>Corymbia tessellaris</b>	Moreton Bay Ash	Handsome tree with smooth trunk and characteristic sock of rough bark at the base. Tolerant of wide range of conditions including dry inland. (Myrtaceae)
<b>Corymbia torelliana</b>	Cadaghi	Medium to tall tree with smooth straight trunk and rounded crown. Bark sheds to reveal lovely green new trunk. Very hardy. Suitable for all sites including dry land. (Myrtaceae)
<b>Cryptocarya triplinervis</b>	Brown Laurel	Small hardy, bushy tree with small white flowers and black fruit which attracts birds. Food plant of Blue Triangle Butterfly. (Lauraceae)
<b>Eucalyptus acmenioides</b>	White Mahogany	Medium tree with rough fibrous bark. (Myrtaceae)
<b>Eucalyptus camaldulensis</b>	River Red Gum	Fast growing, very hardy tree with smooth bark. Stately form. Ideal tree for difficult situations. (Myrtaceae)
<b>Eucalyptus cloeziana</b>	Gympie Messmate	Medium to tall tree with rough lower bark and smooth white upper trunk and branches. Useful timber. (Myrtaceae)
<b>Eucalyptus exserta</b>	Yellow Messmate	Small tree with attractive narrow, weeping foliage. White flowers in summer. Hardy. (Myrtaceae)
<b>Eucalyptus grandis</b>	Rose Gum	Very tall, fast growing gum with beautiful white trunk. Unsuitable for high wind areas. Timber tree. (Myrtaceae)

Latin name	Common name	Description
<b>Eucalyptus melanophloia</b>	Silver Leaf Ironbark	(Myrtaceae)
<b>Eucalyptus microcorys</b>	Tallow Wood	Tall, fast growing bushy timber tree. Useful as inclusion in windbreak but don't use exclusively, due to brittleness. (Myrtaceae)
<b>Eucalyptus moluccana</b>	Grey Box	Medium tree with rough lower bark and smooth white upper trunk and branches. Timber tree. (Myrtaceae)
<b>Eucalyptus nesophila</b>	Cape York Bloodwood	Small to medium-sized or occasionally tall tree with creamy white flowers. Common on Cape York Peninsula. (Myrtaceae)
<b>Eucalyptus pellita</b>	Red Mahogany	Medium to tall tree with rough bark and dark green foliage. Excellent timber tree. (Myrtaceae)
<b>Eucalyptus platyphylla</b>	Poplar Gum	Medium tree with smooth white bark which peels to reveal a salmon pink trunk. Masses of white flowers in summer. Deciduous in the dry. (Myrtaceae)
<b>Eucalyptus propinqua</b>	Small Fruited Grey Gum	Medium to tall tree with smooth bark. Bark shed in strips - newly exposed surface orange. (Myrtaceae)
<b>Eucalyptus resinifera</b>	Red Messmate	Fast growing, medium to large tree with attractive foliage. Very hardy. Timber tree. (Myrtaceae)
<b>Eucalyptus rhodops</b>		(Myrtaceae)
<b>Eucalyptus robusta</b>	Swamp Mahogany	Fast growing, medium to tall tree with dark glossy foliage. Suitable for most situations. Will tolerate damp spots. (Myrtaceae)
<b>Eucalyptus staigeriana</b>	Lemon Scented Ironbark	Medium tree with grey foliage and very strong lemon scent to the leaves when they are crushed. A rare plant in the wild. (Myrtaceae)
<b>Eucalyptus tereticornis</b>	Forest Red Gum	Fast growing, tall stately tree with smooth, mottled trunk and white flowers. Timber tree. (Myrtaceae)
<b>Eucalyptus tetradonta</b>	Stringybark	(Myrtaceae)
<b>Ficus septica</b>	Septic Fig	Large shrub or small tree. Bright green foliage with white veins. Small green fruit which are eaten by fig parrots. Best in semi-shade. (Moraceae)
<b>Ficus superba</b>	Superb Fig	Attractive weeping fig with large, glossy leaves. Beautiful soft copper coloured new growth. Ideal as a tub plant for patio or indoors. Good shade tree. (Moraceae)
<b>Grevillea robusta</b>	Silky Oak	Hardy tree with open habit and mass of orange flowers which attract birds. Excellent timber species. (Proteaceae)
<b>Guioa acutifolia</b>	Glossy Tamarind	Small tree with dark green leaves. Mass of small white flowers. Quite hardy. A useful screen plant. (Sapindaceae)

Latin name	Common name	Description
<b>Khaya senegalensis</b>	African Mahogany	Exotic timber tree. High value hardwood timber. Hardy. Excellent for the dry tropics. (Meliaceae)
<b>Lomandra hystrix</b>	Mat-Rush	Attractive clumping plant with stiff, dark green foliage. Does very well in semi-shade. Very hardy with perfumed flowers. (Asparagaceae)
<b>Lomandra longifolia</b>	Spiny-Headed Mat-Rush	Attractive clumping plant with stiff, dark green foliage. Suitable for rockeries. Very hardy with perfumed flowers. (Asparagaceae)
<b>Melaleuca alternifolia</b>	Tea Tree	Large, thick bushy shrub. Very showy. White flowers. Quite hardy and tolerates wet spots. Leaves contain "Tea Tree Oil". (Myrtaceae)
<b>Melaleuca bracteata</b>	Black Tea Tree	Tall bushy shrub with bright green foliage and dense habit. Small white flowers. A very hardy plant which is an excellent screen. (Myrtaceae)
<b>Melaleuca leucadendra</b>	Weeping Paperbark	Large tree with weeping foliage and thick white papery bark. Masses of white flowers laden with nectar. Excellent along watercourses and in a damp spot. (Myrtaceae)
<b>Melaleuca linariifolia</b>	Snow in Summer	Large, dense, bushy shrub. Makes an excellent screen. Masses of beautiful white flowers. A hardy shrub which does well in a damp situation. (Myrtaceae)
<b>Melaleuca quinquenervia</b>	Paper-Barked Tea tree	Large shrub to small tree bearing masses of creamy bottlebrush flowers that are rich in nectar. Excellent for a boggy spot. (Myrtaceae)
<b>Melaleuca viridiflora</b>	Broad Leaved Paperbark	Shrub to small tree often with twisted habit. Flowers mostly greenish-cream, but red/green, pink and bright red flowers also. (Myrtaceae)
<b>Phyllanthus cuscutiflorus</b>	Pink Phyllanthus	Large, dense, very attractive bushy shrub with beautiful foliage. Masses of small pink flowers. Ideal screen plant. Very fast growing. (Phyllanthaceae)
<b>Polyscias macgillivrayi</b>	Macgillivray's Basswood	Understorey shrub from Cape York Peninsula about 3-4 metres tall. Glossy green compound leaves. Large terminal inflorescence of flowers and fruits. (Araliaceae)
<b>Syzygium australe</b>	Creek Satinash	Large shrub to small tree. Bushy and hardy. Ideal as a screen plant. Masses of white flowers followed by edible pink fruit. (Myrtaceae)
<b>Thespesia populneoides</b>	Pacific Rosewood	An attractive tree to 15 m with light-green, heart-shaped leaves. Flowers are hibiscus-like, yellow, fading to pink, followed by small black fruit. Relative of Hibiscus and Cotton (Malvaceae)
