Common name	Latin name	Description
	<i>Eucalyptus rhodops</i>	(Myrtaceae)
African Mahogany	<i>Khaya senegalensis</i>	Exotic timber tree. High value hardwood timber. Hardy. Excellent for the dry tropics. (Meliaceae)
Black Bean	<i>Castanospermum australe</i>	Medium spreading tree renowned for its lovely timber. Masses of yellow flowers along the branches. Large decorative woody seed pods. Often slow growing for first few years. Benefits from protection when young. (Fabaceae)
Black Tea Tree	<i>Melaleuca bracteata</i>	Tall bushy shrub with bright green foliage and dense habit. Small white flowers. A very hardy plant which is an excellent screen. (Myrtaceae)
Black Wattle	<i>Acacia melanoxylon</i>	Tree with creamy white flowers. Fast growing and suitable for frosty areas. Timber tree. (Fabaceae)
Boodyarra	<i>Aglaia sapindina</i>	Small tree with compound leaves and yellow flowers followed by masses of orange fruit. Attractive to birds. (Meliaceae)
Brisbane Wattle	<i>Acacia fimbriata</i>	Fast growing large shrub to small tree with beautiful weeping foliage and dainty yellow fluffy flowers. Best in cooler climates. (Fabaceae)
Broad Leaved Paperbark	<i>Melaleuca viridiflora</i>	Shrub to small tree often with twisted habit. Flowers mostly greenish-cream, but red/green, pink and bright red flowers also. (Myrtaceae)
Brown Laurel	<i>Cryptocarya triplinervis</i>	Small hardy, bushy tree with small white flowers and black fruit which attracts birds. Food plant of Blue Triangle Butterfly. (Lauraceae)
Brown Salwood	<i>Acacia mangium</i>	Extremely fast growing hardy tree with large green leaves and creamy flowers. Good timber. (Fabaceae)
Cadaghi	<i>Corymbia torelliana</i>	Medium to tall tree with smooth straight trunk and rounded crown. Bark sheds to reveal lovely green new trunk. Very hardy. Suitable for all sites including dry land. (Myrtaceae)
Cape York Bloodwood	<i>Eucalyptus nesophila</i>	Small to medium-sized or occasionally tall tree with creamy white flowers. Common on Cape York Peninsula. (Myrtaceae)
Creek Satinash	<i>Syzygium australe</i>	Large shrub to small tree. Bushy and hardy. Ideal as a screen plant. Masses of white flowers followed by edible pink fruit. (Myrtaceae)
Ear-Pod Wattle	<i>Acacia auriculiformis</i>	Tree with yellow flowers. Very hardy and fast growing. Dark green shiny leaves. Dense crown. (Fabaceae)
Forest Red Gum	<i>Eucalyptus tereticornis</i>	Fast growing, tall stately tree with smooth, mottled trunk and white flowers. Timber tree. (Myrtaceae)
Glossy Tamarind	<i>Guioa acutifolia</i>	Small tree with dark green leaves. Mass of small white flowers. Quite hardy. A useful screen plant. (Sapindaceae)
Grey Box	<i>Eucalyptus moluccana</i>	Medium tree with rough lower bark and smooth white upper trunk and branches. Timber tree. (Myrtaceae)

Common name	Latin name	Description
Gympie Messmate	<i>Eucalyptus cloeziana</i>	Medium to tall tree with rough lower bark and smooth white upper trunk and branches. Useful timber. (Myrtaceae)
Hickory Wattle	<i>Acacia aulacocarpa</i>	Fast growing and very hardy tree with masses of yellow flowers. Rounded dense crown. Timber tree. (Fabaceae)
Lancewood	<i>Acacia shirleyi</i>	Small tree with yellow flowers and grey foliage. Extremely hardy. Suitable for the dry inland. (Fabaceae)
Lemon Scented Gum	<i>Corymbia citriodora</i>	Tall, fast growing tree with beautiful smooth trunk and lemon scent to leaves. Hardy. Timber tree. (Myrtaceae)
Lemon Scented Ironbark	<i>Eucalyptus staigeriana</i>	Medium tree with grey foliage and very strong lemon scent to the leaves when they are crushed. A rare plant in the wild. (Myrtaceae)
Liniment Tree	<i>Asteromyrtus symphyocarpa</i>	Decorative large shrub or small tree with weeping habit and globular yellow-orange fluffy flowers. Tolerates a wide range of soils. Suitable for screening. (Myrtaceae)
Macgillivray's Basswood	<i>Polyscias macgillivrayi</i>	Understorey shrub from Cape York Peninsula about 3-4 metres tall. Glossy green compound leaves. Large terminal inflorescence of flowers and fruits. (Araliaceae)
Mat-Rush	<i>Lomandra hystrix</i>	Attractive clumping plant with stiff, dark green foliage. Does very well in semi-shade. Very hardy with perfumed flowers. (Asparagaceae)
Moreton Bay Ash	<i>Corymbia tessellaris</i>	Handsome tree with smooth trunk and characteristic sock of rough bark at the base. Tolerant of wide range of conditions including dry inland. (Myrtaceae)
Northern Golden Wattle	<i>Acacia leptocarpa</i>	Small tree with dark green foliage and spikes of bright orange flowers. Very hardy. Plant in full sun. (Fabaceae)
Northern Wattle	<i>Acacia crassicarpa</i>	Small tree with large leaves and yellow flowers. Very fast growing and hardy. (Fabaceae)
Northern Wattle	<i>Acacia flavescens</i>	Tall shrub or small tree with large leaves. Attractive red/purple new growth. Masses of fluffy white flowers. Hardy & fast growing. (Fabaceae)
Pacific Rosewood	<i>Thespesia populneoides</i>	An attractive tree to 15 m with light-green, heart-shaped leaves. Flowers are hibiscus-like, yellow, fading to pink, followed by small black fruit. Relative of Hibiscus and Cotton (Malvaceae)
Paper-Barked Tea tree	<i>Melaleuca quinquenervia</i>	Large shrub to small tree bearing masses of creamy bottlebrush flowers that are rich in nectar. Excellent for a boggy spot. (Myrtaceae)
Pink Phyllanthus	<i>Phyllanthus cuscutiflorus</i>	Large, dense, very attractive bushy shrub with beautiful foliage. Masses of small pink flowers. Ideal screen plant. Very fast growing. (Phyllanthaceae)
Poplar Gum	<i>Eucalyptus platyphylla</i>	Medium tree with smooth white bark which peels to reveal a salmon pink trunk. Masses of white flowers in summer. Deciduous in the dry. (Myrtaceae)
Queensland Kauri	<i>Agathis robusta</i>	A giant, slow growing, tropical conifer from Queensland's coastal ranges with broad, thick-textured, dark green leaves. An ancient Gondwanan relic with iconic status in Queensland. (Araucariaceae)

Common name	Latin name	Description
Red Bottlebrush	Callistemon polandii	Compact well shaped medium shrub. Large red brushes with golden tipped stamens. (Myrtaceae)
Red Mahogany	Eucalyptus pellita	Medium to tall tree with rough bark and dark green foliage. Excellent timber tree. (Myrtaceae)
Red Messmate	Eucalyptus resinifera	Fast growing, medium to large tree with attractive foliage. Very hardy. Timber tree. (Myrtaceae)
Red Throated Bloodwood	Corymbia rhodops	Small bloodwood with spectacular terminal clusters of cream flowers which have a deep red centre. (Myrtaceae)
River Red Gum	Eucalyptus camaldulensis	Fast growing, very hardy tree with smooth bark. Stately form. Ideal tree for difficult situations. (Myrtaceae)
Rose Gum	Eucalyptus grandis	Very tall, fast growing gum with beautiful white trunk. Unsuitable for high wind areas. Timber tree. (Myrtaceae)
Septic Fig	Ficus septica	Large shrub or small tree. Bright green foliage with white veins. Small green fruit which are eaten by fig parrots. Best in semi-shade. (Moraceae)
Silky Oak	Grevillea robusta	Hardy tree with open habit and mass of orange flowers which attract birds. Excellent timber species. (Proteaceae)
Silver Leaf Ironbark	Eucalyptus melanophloia	(Myrtaceae)
Silver-Leaved Wattle	Acacia holosericea	Large shrub with beautiful silvery leaves and bright yellow flowers. Very hardy and fast growing. Full sun. (Fabaceae)
Sim's Wattle	Acacia simsii	Small to medium shrub with narrow lime-green leaves and very showy display of bright yellow flowers. Hardy. Full sun. (Fabaceae)
Small Fruited Grey Gum	Eucalyptus propinqua	Medium to tall tree with smooth bark. Bark shed in strips - newly exposed surface orange. (Myrtaceae)
Snow in Summer	Melaleuca linariifolia	Large, dense, bushy shrub. Makes an excellent screen. Masses of beautiful white flowers. A hardy shrub which does well in a damp situation. (Myrtaceae)
Spiny-Headed Mat-Rush	Lomandra longifolia	Attractive clumping plant with stiff, dark green foliage. Suitable for rockeries. Very hardy with perfumed flowers. (Asparagaceae)
Spotted Gum	Corymbia maculata	Medium to tall tree. Smooth bark which shreds in small irregular flakes giving a spotted appearance. Timber tree. (Myrtaceae)
Stringybark	Eucalyptus tetradonta	(Myrtaceae)
Superb Fig	Ficus superba	Attractive weeping fig with large, glossy leaves. Beautiful soft copper coloured new growth. Ideal as a tub plant for patio or indoors. Good shade tree. (Moraceae)

Common name	Latin name	Description
Swamp Mahogany	<i>Eucalyptus robusta</i>	Fast growing, medium to tall tree with dark glossy foliage. Suitable for most situations. Will tolerate damp spots. (Myrtaceae)
Tallow Wood	<i>Eucalyptus microcorys</i>	Tall, fast growing bushy timber tree. Useful as inclusion in windbreak but don't use exclusively, due to brittleness. (Myrtaceae)
Tea Tree	<i>Melaleuca alternifolia</i>	Large, thick bushy shrub. Very showy. White flowers. Quite hardy and tolerates wet spots. Leaves contain "Tea Tree Oil". (Myrtaceae)
Tinaroo Dazzler	<i>Callistemon recurvus</i>	Medium weeping shrub with small leaves and bright red flowers. Very hardy. (Myrtaceae)
Wallum Bottlebrush	<i>Callistemon pachyphyllus</i>	Hardy, slender shrub with large bottlebrush flowers in spring and autumn. Will tolerate damp soil situations. Benefits from regular pruning. (Myrtaceae)
Weeping Bottlebrush	<i>Callistemon viminalis</i>	Medium to large shrub with red bottlebrush flowers. Weeping foliage. Fast growing and hardy. (Myrtaceae)
Weeping Paperbark	<i>Melaleuca leucadendra</i>	Large tree with weeping foliage and thick white papery bark. Masses of white flowers laden with nectar. Excellent along watercourses and in a damp spot. (Myrtaceae)
Wenlock Wattle	<i>Acacia fleckeri</i>	Small tree with yellow flowers in May and June. Hardy and fast growing. (Fabaceae)
White Bottlebrush	<i>Callistemon salignus</i>	White flowers. Makes a good screen. (Myrtaceae)
White Mahogany	<i>Eucalyptus acmenioides</i>	Medium tree with rough fibrous bark. (Myrtaceae)
Yellow Messmate	<i>Eucalyptus exserta</i>	Small tree with attractive narrow, weeping foliage. White flowers in summer. Hardy. (Myrtaceae)
Yellowjacket	<i>Corymbia leichhardtii</i>	Small to medium tree with attractive golden to orange/yellow bark. Terminal spikes of white flowers. Hardy. (Myrtaceae)
Zig-Zag Wattle	<i>Acacia macradenia</i>	Very large, fast growing, spreading shrub with zig-zag branchlets. Masses of very bright, dark yellow flowers in profusion in spring. (Fabaceae)
